Slide 2. Advantages of working in the Russian Federation for foreign students:

Gaining work experience can become the basis for obtaining a temporary residence permit (TRP) or a permanent residence permit (PR) in the future.

The Russian labor market is constantly changing, and some specialties are becoming more in demand than others. This slide shows a list of the most in-demand specialties. Knowing these specialties will help you navigate your job search and increase your chances of successful employment.

Slide 4. The employment process for foreign students in Russia:

Foreign students studying full-time at Russian universities have the right to work without obtaining a work permit (patent) for the entire period of study. However, it is necessary to obtain a SNILS (insurance number of an individual personal account) to pay taxes and social contributions.

When looking for a job:

- Use online resources.
- Participate in job fairs.
- Use social networks
- Contact your acquaintances and friends.

When writing a resume, study the examples accepted in Russia. The resume must be written in Russian (unless otherwise specified in the vacancy). Be sure to check the grammar and spelling, ask a native speaker to check your resume. If you do not have work experience in Russia, emphasize your work experience in other countries, internships, volunteer work, projects.

Slide 5. Documents required for employment:

We recommend that you prepare all necessary documents in advance to avoid delays and problems when applying for a job.

Always comply with the migration and labor laws of the Russian Federation.

Monitor changes in legislation and document requirements.

Do not hesitate to seek help from your university's career center, lawyers, or migration services. Improve your Russian language skills, as this is a key factor in finding a job.

Slide 6. State support for foreign students:

We understand that you may need help and support in a new country. Therefore, the state has developed a number of programs that will help you in the process of studying and finding a job. You can get more detailed information about the support measures for international students from the university's International Cooperation Department.
